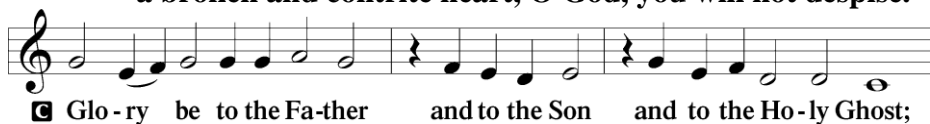

## *Genesis 3*

Now the serpent was more crafty than any other beast of the field that the LORD God had made.

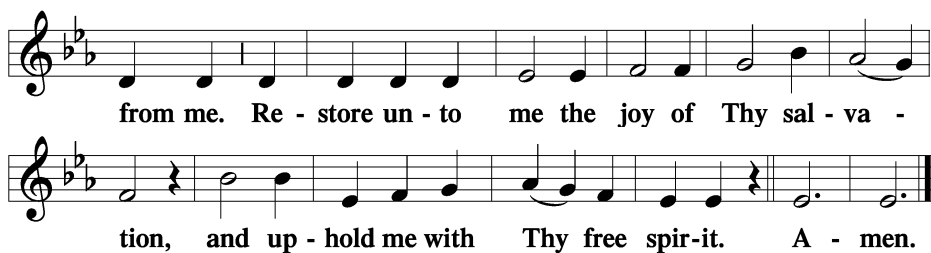


