Luke 17:11–19

P The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke, the seventeenth chapter.

the communion of saints,

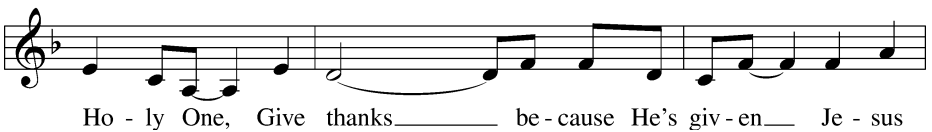
