Old Testament Reading

Ruth 1:1–19a

In the days when the judges ruled there was a famine in the land, and a man of Bethlehem in Judah went to sojourn in the country of Moab, he and his wife and his two sons. The name of the man was Elimelech and the name of his wife Naomi, and the names of his two sons were Mahlon and Chilion. They were Ephrathites from Bethlehem in Judah. They went into the country of Moab and remained there. But Elimelech, the husband of Naomi, died, and she was left with her two sons. These took Moabite wives; the name of the one was Orpah and the name of the other Ruth. They lived there about ten years, and both Mahlon and Chilion died, so that the woman was left without her two sons and her husband.

Then she arose with her daughters-in-law to return from the country of Moab, for she had heard in the fields of Moab that the LORD had visited his people and

given them food. So she set out from the place where she was with her two daughters-in-law, and they went on the way to return to the land of Judah. But Naomi said to her two daughters-in-law, “Go, return each of you to her mother’s house. May the LORD deal kindly with you, as you have dealt with the dead and with me. The LORD grant that you may find rest, each of you in the house of her husband!” Then she kissed them, and they lifted up their voices and wept. And they said to her, “No, we will return with you to your people.” But Naomi said, “Turn back, my daughters; why will you go with me? Have I yet sons in my womb that they may become your husbands? Turn back, my daughters; go your way, for I am too old to have a husband. If I should say I have hope, even if I should have a husband this night and should bear sons, would you therefore wait till they were grown? Would you therefore refrain from marrying? No, my daughters, for it is exceedingly bitter to me for your sake that the hand of the LORD has gone out against me.” Then they lifted up their voices and wept again. And Orpah kissed her mother-in-law, but Ruth clung to her.

And she said, “See, your sister-in-law has gone back to her people and to her gods; return after your sister-in-law.” But Ruth said, “Do not urge me to leave you or to return from following you. For where you go I will go, and where you lodge I will lodge. Your people shall be my people, and your God my God. Where you die I will die, and there will I be buried. May the LORD do so to me and more also if anything but death parts me from you.” And when Naomi saw that she was determined to go with her, she said no more.

So the two of them went on until they came to Bethlehem.

CELEBRATING 110 YEARS OF LADIES GROUPS HERE AT

IMMANUEL: The Ladies Aid was started on October 5, 1912 with 39 members. Their first meeting was held at the home of Mrs. M. O. Johnsrud. The meeting opened by reading Psalm 23 followed by a message from Rev. P. H. Ristau. Meetings were held in the homes of members until 1930 when they were held here at the church. A 25th anniversary of the Ladies Aid was held on October 17, 1937 in the high school gym. In 1945 our Ladies Aid decided to join the LWML (Lutheran Women's Missionary League – an auxiliary of the LCMS). This went before the voters of our congregation and was approved at the voters meeting on January 13, 1946. A 50th anniversary of the Ladies Aid was held on November 4, 1962 here at the church. At that time there were 103 members. The Ladies Aid served at banquets, hosted rallies, and pastors' conferences. They began making quilts for World Relief in 1978 and have been busy quilting ever since. Another ladies group, Immanuel Auxiliary, was started on February 11, 1976, with 18 members (founding members still here at Immanuel include: Carol Frantsen, Adele Hage, Beverly Hall, and Berniece Pauling). This group met on evenings as many of them worked away from home and were unable to attend the afternoon meetings of the Ladies Aid. The Auxiliary joined the LWML in April 1976. Both groups have been instrumental in purchasing new items and in upkeep of both the church and parsonage. Ladies Aid and Ladies Auxiliary joined together to become the Immanuel LWML and had their first meeting on January 8, 2017 as a Prayer Service with 42 active members and 5 honorary members. Current membership for the LWML is 25 active members and 15 honorary. All ladies of the congregation are welcome to join the LWML! Check out the LWML display on the wall in the narthex by the carport door for a look at some LWML items over the years along with founding member lists of the Ladies Aid, Ladies Auxiliary, and LWML
