- *Please make an attractive tag with all your items listed on it, plus the total of your basket.*

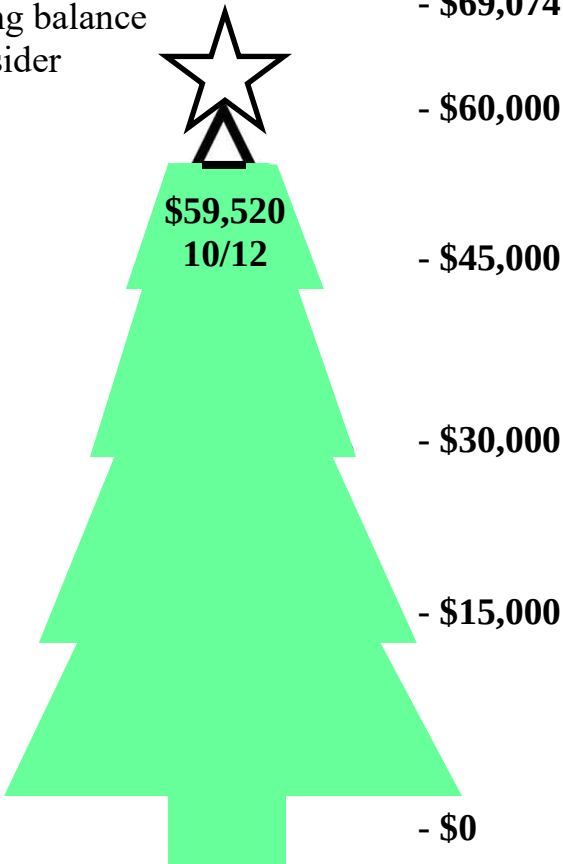
