May, 2025 Pastoral Epistle

When a stranger sojourns with you in your land, you shall not do him wrong. You shall treat the stranger who sojourns with you as the native among you, and you shall love him as yourself, for you were [once] strangers... I am the Lord your God (Leviticus 19: 33-34). Let brotherly love continue. Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers, for thereby some have entertained angels unawares (Hebrews 13:1-2). Therefore welcome one another as Christ has welcomed you, for the glory of God (Romans 15:7).



here can be little room for doubt about the position of the Bible when it comes to how we should treat treat the stranger, or "sojourner", meaning someone who resides temporarily: he or she should be welcomed, embraced, and loved. The gospel approach is perhaps best summed up by Jesus in His discourse on the sheep and the goats (Matthew 25:31-46), when He explains that He will one day come again to judge all people and will look favorably on those who have welcomed a stranger, because in doing so, they welcomed Him. The same could be said for the many new immigrants we see coming across our borders, refugees and people looking for a fresh start in a land of freedom. God once told His people Israel, "You shall also love the stranger, for you were strangers in the land of Egypt" (Dt 10:19). And again in Leviticus 19:34, "The alien who resides with you shall be to you as the citizen among you; you shall love the alien as yourself, for you were aliens in the land of Egypt: I am the Lord your God." The Israelites were once aliens living in Egypt. When they were generous in their treatment of other people, familiar or alien, they honored God's faithfulness to them. Also, God in Leviticus 19:18, tells His people, "You shall not take vengeance or bear a grudge... but you shall love your neighbor as yourself."

There was once a pastor and his wife who awoke one morning to find a note from their neighbor on their front door. It read: "We've gone away until tomorrow night. Please look after Cleo [the family dog] for us. If she howls and wants to go inside, a spare key is hanging on a nail by the garage door. Thanks." The pastor was glad to read that note, because it meant they had built a strong bridge of trust in the two years since they had moved in, even though the neighbors were not part of his parish. God's people in the Old Testament were instructed not to rob their neighbors (Lv 19:13), to judge righteously (19:15), to not do anything that would threaten the lives of their neighbors (19:16), and to love and forgive them (19:18). In this way they would give witness to the nations that Yahweh was the true God and that those who worshiped Him were loving, honest, and just in their personal relationships and in their business dealings. What was true for God's people then is also true for us today as those who follow Christ Jesus, our risen Lord and Savior. We too should love our neighbors, all of them, and that includes more than just the people who live next door. Jesus defined our neighbor as anyone in need. For example in the parable of the Good Samaritan, Jesus answers the question: "Who is my neighbor?" At the end of the parable, Jesus turns the question back upon the other saying: "Which of these three, do you think, proved to be a neighbor to the man who fell among the robbers?" And the other replied, "The one who showed him mercy." Jesus then said to him, "You go, and do likewise" (Lu 10:36-37). We may have to go out of our way, once in a while. It might even mean making an emergency run to the hospital or giving up a half gallon of milk when we ourselves are running low. But a good neighbor policy fulfills God's command to "Love one another." And it may even help to bring someone else to Christ. Let us pray.

Lord Jesus, make me more like You, that I grow in faith and love for my neighbor, especially when it means welcoming a stranger. May people also see You in my actions as I reach out to them with Your love. Fill me today, Lord, with a desire to do good and not harm, but to welcome the sojourner and everyone I encounter. In Your name I pray, Amen.

MEMBERS OF IMMANUEL:

Our current rate of giving and tuition has continued to fall short of current expenses. The church's operating reserves have been continually depleted due to short falls in the budget and are running out. At our current rate of income to expenses we will need to borrow from the bank an estimated \$75,000 beginning in June of 2025. From the year 2022-2023 when we raised dollars for the new church organ our total income was \$137,563 higher than our current projections. From that year to our current giving and tuition, weekly giving is down \$2,645 per week which has been shown in our bulletin each month. Our rate of giving has not increased with the rate of increasing costs to operate the church and school. During our Pastoral Vacancy we have also seen our attendance drop from 147 average attendance in 2023 to 131 in 2024. We must remember to keep the mission of our church and school at the forefront.

UPDATE FROM PRINCIPAL

JENNISSEN: Governor Walz has proposed a State budget that will eliminate State Funding for Private Schools like ILS. What does this mean for ILS? We utilize the public school buses, nurses and guidance counselors to support our students. We also receive reimbursement for some of our instructional supplies. These cuts would negatively impact ILS by increasing our operating costs and eliminating revenue we receive. Please go to



He is risen! He is risen indeed, alleluia! This truth cannot be spoken enough! As Believers, the most important day of the year, Resurrection Day is behind us. So, what now? After the crucifixion, Jesus' disciples were asking the same question, but without the gift of hindsight we enjoy. They were holed up in a room possibly having heard rumors that Jesus was alive. Luke 24, after the Resurrection, Jesus appeared to the Disciples and proved who He was by His nail-scarred hands and pierced side. He was truly risen! The Disciples' "what now?" turned into a "what's next?" In Luke 24:45-49 Jesus reveals that answer. First, He opened their minds so they could understand the scriptures, next He clearly outlined the Gospel, promised to send them the Father's designated Helper, the Holy Spirit and finally, gave them their mission: "repentance for the forgiveness of sins will be preached in my name to all nations." Jesus knew His ministry on earth was ending, but the ministry would continue, through His Disciples. And, over the following 40 days, Jesus encouraged, taught and prepared them for this eternally important work - sharing the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

The call of the Disciples is our call. In Acts 1:19 Jesus tells us, "...you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." God, through the example of Jesus, has called us all to ministry. You might think, "Who me? Am I equipped for this? What does this look like? What would I say?" I'd be thinking the same thing, but then I look back at the verses listed above, the "how" becomes clear. First, let's pray that God would open our minds so we can understand His Word. Next, let's cling to the promised Holy Spirit as He will help us (John 14:26); finally, let's exercise our faith through trusting and obeying. Remember, it's in God working through you (Zech. 4:6), that His truth will hit the mark.

What now? It's time for us to do the good works God prepared in advance for us to do (Eph. 2:10) What a call! What a message to share! Oh, what a Risen Savior!


