Thanksgiving is strange. We stop to remember to give thanks for.....? (Fill in the blank)

One of my core memories is learning about Thanksgiving in preschool over a bowl of stone soup. However, as I got older, I realized the Thanksgiving that we learned about in the preschool, is not like the Thanksgiving we celebrate today. I went to find why?

After several failed attempts by President Washington, and people like Sarah Hale, finally in 1863 President Lincoln declares the last Thursday in November to be a National Day of Thanksgiving. A new holiday is born. For the simplest reason, reconciliation.

2 Corinthians 5:18 "All of this is from God, who reconciled us to Himself through Christ and gave us the ministry of reconciliation." When Jesus brought you with His blood, we are no longer enemies.


CHALLENGE FROM THE FINANCE BOARD:

The Christmas in July Service is always a special service for our congregation. We sing some of our favorite Christmas hymns, worship outside in our Lord's creation, and gather together afterwards for a meal. At this service we also get the opportunity to show support for our school with gifts toward the Teacher Salary Fund. The gifts towards this crucial mission go towards providing payroll to our outstanding faculty who teach the young students of Immanuel to grow in Christ. The end of this school year marked our 126th anniversary. As a gift to ensure that the mission of the school in Immanuel is as eternal as God's love, let us challenge ourselves to give 12.6% of our salaries and benefits of school faculty in the amount of \$69,074 as a special giving project. There has been an anonymous donor who has gifted \$25,000 to this fund leaving a remaining balance of \$44,074. Please consider making a gift above and beyond your normal offering. There will be a tracking thermometer in the Narthex to follow along with as we work towards this goal.


From the Principal:

A scripture that's been on my mind that I've been committing to memory is Colossians 3:8 "But now you must put them all away: anger, wrath, malice, slander, and obscene talk from your mouth."

Maybe it's coming to mind from the political climate we're in as I cannot remember in my lifetime people that are more polar-opposite in their thinking. Most people are too busy making a living and taking care of their families to be diving into the divided drama, but one thing's for sure, fingers are pointed, emotions are elevated and there's screaming for "justice", whatever that means.

Or, maybe God's working on me. What of Colossians 3:8 do I "own" when I honestly look in the mirror? How about you? It's quite easy to point the finger at someone else's choices while I, with a log in my eye, bump into a wall. When we consider God's Word from Job 4:9, we should shudder at our sin: "As I have seen, those who plow iniquity and sow trouble reap the same. By the breath of God they perish, and by the blast of his anger they are consumed." What we sow with our lips, or our keyboard, and we will reap. Very literally, "Lord help me; help us."

As I pondered an honest look in the mirror, God's Word was right for the moment in the way of a Lutheran Hour Ministry's Daily Devotion by Rev. Dr. Michael Ziegler. Titled: "Worn", it focuses on the failure of Moses to obey God completely, to meet God's high standards. Moses was denied the opportunity to enter the Promised Land due to His sin, but in the end, in His mercy, God allowed Moses to see it with his own eyes, along with Elijah. I love how Dr. Ziegler describes the love of God through the sacrifice of Jesus: "Moses got to come along for the ride after all, because Jesus held God's standard for us. He gave Himself on the cross to raise us up into the heart of God." Renewed, restored and looking forward, we are reminded in Colossians 3:12 that we are to, "Put on then, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, compassionate hearts, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience." Did you catch that? We can put on these traits because we are holy, beloved and chosen in Jesus Christ. Put away the things in Colossians 3:8 and put on the things in 3:12, sounds good to me. How about you?
