Old Testament Reading

Genesis 12:1–9

The LORD said to Abram, "Go from your country and your kindred and your father's house to the land that I will show you. And I will make of you a great nation, and I will bless you and make your name great, so that you will be a blessing. I will bless those who bless you, and him who dishonors you I will curse, and in you all the families of the earth shall be blessed."

So Abram went, as the LORD had told him, and Lot went with him. Abram was seventy-five years old when he departed from Haran. Romans 4:1-8, 13-17

What then shall we say was gained by Abraham, our forefather according to the flesh? For if Abraham was justified by works, he has something to boast about, but not before God. For what does the Scripture say? "Abraham believed God, and it was counted to him as righteousness." Now to the one who works, his wages are not counted as a gift but as his due. And to the one

who does not work but trusts him who justifies the ungodly, his faith is counted as righteousness, just as David also speaks of the blessing of the one to whom God counts righteousness apart from works:

"Blessed are those whose lawless deeds are forgiven,

and whose sins are covered;

blessed is the man against whom the Lord will not count his sin." . . .

For the promise to Abraham and his offspring that he would be heir of the world did not come through the law but through the righteousness of faith. For if it is the adherents of the law who are to be the heirs, faith is null and the promise is void. For the law brings wrath, but where there is no law there is no transgression.

That is why it depends on faith, in order that the promise may rest on grace and be guaranteed to all his offspring—not only to the adherent of the law but also to the one who shares the faith of Abraham, who is the father of us all, as it is written, "I have made you the father of many nations"—in the presence of the God in whom he believed, who gives life to the dead and calls into existence the things that do not exist.

John 3:1-17

- The Holy Gospel according to St. John, the third chapter.

Now there was a man of the Pharisees named Nicodemus, a ruler of the Jews. This man came to Jesus by night and said to him, "Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher come from God, for no one can do these signs that you do unless God is with him." Jesus answered him, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born again he cannot see the kingdom of God." Nicodemus said to him, "How can a man be born when he is old? Can he enter a second time into his mother's womb and be born?" Jesus answered, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God. That which is born of the flesh is flesh, and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit. Do not marvel that I said to you, 'You must be born again.' The wind blows where it wishes, and you hear its sound, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit."

Nicodemus said to him, "How can these things be?" Jesus answered him, "Are you the teacher of Israel and yet you do not understand these things? Truly, truly, I say to you, we speak of what we know, and bear witness to what we have seen, but you do not receive our testimony. If I have told you earthly things and you do not believe, how can you believe if I tell you heavenly things? No one has ascended into heaven except he who descended from heaven, the Son of Man. And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, that whoever believes in him may have eternal life.

"For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him."





NEW CHURCH ORGAN: We are in the process of getting a new organ here at Immanuel. Our current organ is 73 years old. It was installed as a brand new pipe

organ in 1950. We started to have some issues with it this summer. It is time to replace it. For those who were not at the January voters meeting, it was voted on and approved for the church to purchase a new organ. The organists have done some research and

picked out an organ. The new organ cost is \$64,130 plus some minor expenses for lift and electrical. We have been blessed in receiving \$21,900 in donations (as of 1/27/23). That puts us a third of the way there. Thank you so much to those who have donated. Any donations given should be earmarked "organ". Help us make a joyful noise unto the Lord!

INTERESTED IN A LITTLE HISTORY OF OUR CHURCH'S

ORGANS (PART 3)? Our current organ is a Wicks 2 manual 15 rank pipe organ. Prior to that our organ was a Kilgen. This Kilgen two manual pipe organ was bought for about \$1,100 for the church in 1912. It was installed in 1913. Our current church building was built in 1940. According to the Golden Anniversary and Church Dedication book (circa November 5, 1940): The organ and the choir were placed in the west end of the church in the narthex balcony. This is the best possible position from the standpoint of acoustics and the one that has been used in Christian churches for centuries.

The original Immanuel Lutheran Church was built in 1896.
