

From the Principal:

Cougar Family,

Every day is a good day at Immanuel Lutheran School, but March 21st was an especially good day as God reminded us once again, He provides. We'd been raising money this quarter in our Chapel offerings for people around the world who do not have access to freshwater. Our students learned about children in parts of the world that walk an average of 3.7 miles daily to carry water (not always fresh) back to their family homes to provide water for drinking, bathing and cleaning. Our challenge: for every \$50 we donate, a family receives fresh water. On March 17th, nearly the end of our 3rd quarter, I shared with our students and families that we had raised \$112 toward this opportunity. Well in the following days, God showed up through His givers. By the morning of 3/21 we had raised \$934.70! However, God wasn't done yet. One of our classes stepped up and chipped in another \$100.75 to put us over \$1,000. But, wait... not done yet, another \$140 cash donation showed up and by day's end \$1275.75 was raised. This was enough to provide 25 families with fresh water! If that wasn't enough provision for the day, our copy paper supply had dwindled to less than
