

The whole congregation of the people of Israel grumbled against Moses and Aaron in the wilderness, and the people of Israel said to them, "Would that we had died by the hand of the LORD in the land of Egypt, when we sat by the meat pots and ate bread to the full, for you have brought us out into this wilderness to kill this whole assembly with hunger."

Then the LORD said to Moses, "Behold, I am about to rain bread from heaven for you, and the people shall go out and gather a day's portion every day, that I may test them, whether they will walk in my law or not. On the sixth day, when they prepare what they bring in, it will be twice as much as they gather daily." So Moses and Aaron said to all the people of Israel, "At evening you shall know that it was the LORD who brought you out of the land of Egypt, and in the morning you shall see the glory of the LORD, because he has heard your grumbling against the LORD. For what are we, that you grumble against us?" And Moses said, "When the LORD gives you in the evening meat to eat and in the morning bread to the full, because the LORD has heard your grumbling that you grumble against him—what are we? Your grumbling is not against us but against the LORD."

Then Moses said to Aaron, "Say to the whole congregation of the people of Israel, 'Come near before

the LORD, for he has heard your grumbling." And as soon as Aaron spoke to the whole congregation of the people of Israel, they looked toward the wilderness, and behold, the glory of the LORD appeared in the cloud. And the LORD said to Moses, "I have heard the grumbling of the people of Israel. Say to them, 'At twilight you shall eat meat, and in the morning you shall be filled with bread. Then you shall know that I am the LORD your God."

In the evening quail came up and covered the camp, and in the morning dew lay around the camp. 
"When he ascended on high he led a host of captives,

The Holy Gospel according to St. John, the sixth chapter.

On the next day the crowd that remained on the other side of the sea saw that there had been only one boat there, and that Jesus had not entered the boat with his disciples, but that his disciples had gone away alone. Other boats from Tiberias came near the place where they had eaten the bread after the Lord had given thanks. So when the crowd saw that Jesus was not there, nor his disciples, they themselves got into the boats and went to Capernaum, seeking Jesus.

Jesus then said to them, "Truly, truly, I say to you, it was not Moses who gave you the bread from heaven, but my Father gives you the true bread from heaven. For the bread of God is he who comes down from heaven and gives life to the world." They said to him, "Sir, give us this bread always."




The Words of Our Lord

IMMANUEL CONGREGATION,

Recently, our Board of Education made the decision to leave the Federal/State Hot Lunch Program. This was done thoughtfully and prayerfully as the government does provide funding that covers much of the costs for families. However, the program also requires we, as a school and church, affirm expectations that are contrary to God's Word. Additionally, the government's "free meals" were not free as the reimbursement rate did not cover all of the cost. Finally, the majority of our families felt we should leave the government program.

Not receiving this funding means we are back to paid school lunches by our families. We hope to keep these costs low by receiving donations of food, money and volunteer time. Many have asked, "How can I help?" We are in the process of hiring a Cook, so their input will be critical to answer this question. First of all, pray for the program and the Cook we are in the process of hiring. We know that God will provide the wisdom and resources we need.

If you would be interested in making a monetary donation to the program, it will be used to provide supplies we need and to create an "Angel Fund" for families that will need help with the cost of meals. Hot or Cold lunches will be an option, but there will undoubtedly be a need. Additionally, if you have the ability to help in the kitchen with meal prep, serving, clean-up, etc on a regular or sporadic basis, your name and availability would be great to know. In terms of making food donations, we'll share more once our Cook is aboard.
