He, Jesus, hands them over. He freely gives these goods to you. Done through His grace and mercy. Whether we ask or plea, Jesus gives His gifts won for us.



The Christmas in July Service is always a special service for our congregation. We sing some of our favorite Christmas hymns, worship outside in our Lord's creation, and gather together afterwards for a meal. At this service we also get the opportunity to show support for our school with gifts toward the Teacher Salary Fund. The gifts towards this crucial mission go towards providing payroll to our outstanding faculty who teach the young students of Immanuel to grow in Christ. The end of this school year marked our 126th anniversary. As a gift to ensure that the mission of the school in Immanuel is as eternal as God's love, let us challenge ourselves to give 12.6% of our salaries and benefits of school faculty in the amount of \$69,074 as a special giving project. Revelation 14:6 – "Then I saw another angel flying directly overhead, with an eternal gospel to proclaim to those who dwell on earth, to every nation and tribe and language and people." # From the Principal:

Each year our Staff participates in a Bible Study as we continue to develop our faith with God's leading. This year, Pastor Obermann suggested the book, "Faithful and Flourishing: Strategies for Leading Your Christian School With Excellence." As we have dug into the book and God's word, a central question has guided our learning: "Why does Immanuel Lutheran School exist?" The author of the book we're studying challenges the reader to consider the origin of your school to determine the answer to this question. This put me on a mission to uncover what the founders of ILS considered in 1899 when starting the school. I found the answer in the school's Educational Wing Dedication Service Booklet dated February 10, 1957. Printed there was the scriptural reference for why ILS exists: When they had finished breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter, "Simon, son of John, do you love me more than these?" He said to him, "Yes, Lord; you know that I love you." He said to him, "Feed my lambs." John 21:15

The dedication booklet continues, "When the Immanuel Congregation was only about nine years old the members of this organization recognized their duty over their children. It was their love for Jesus, their concern for the spiritual welfare of their children, their obedience to Christ's command that prompted these members to organize a Christian Day School. In such a school the Word of God would be taught daily to the lambs of Christ and daily the children would be under the influence of Christian training. Here the secular subjects would be taught in the light of God's Holy Word. For over fifty-six years the hopes of the early fathers were fulfilled under the blessing hand of God."

Recently, we began year number 127 at ILS and with God's guidance and empowerment, we aim to continue the call to "feed His lambs." We recognize clearly, God has continued to bless the ministry with the resources we need to feed this year's 116 lambs. Thank you for your continued prayers, support and partnership. We are blessed and honored to carry the torch... with you.

Please note that Basic LERT certification is required before you can attend this Chainsaw training. You may attend the Basic LERT training at Camp Omega the night before if you need that certification. Housing is available at Camp Omega if requested. This training is intended to increase LERT volunteer's skills, knowledge and safety in chainsaw operation so they can provide a critical service to those who do not have the skills or means to perform this dangerous work following a disaster. Class will begin promptly at 8:00 AM and conclude between 4:00 and 5:00 PM. Your LERT Trainer will distribute all material for the class. During the training, participants will learn:

- Safe operation of a chainsaw
- Personal protective equipment (PPE)
- Injury prevention
- How to buck and limb storm-damaged trees
- How to properly clear debris in a safe and beneficial manner
- How to fell trees
- Proper saw maintenance

The morning session is classroom training. The afternoon session is hands-on field chainsaw operation training where participants will learn and demonstrate chainsaw skills.
